





## INSTRUCTIONS FOR SETTING UP, TAKING DOWN, AND TRAVELLING

The Adelante Gallery's designed to be simple for one person to manage, move about in its setting, and travel around to schools and churches in a small car. These instructions aren't sacrosanct, and you should find them easier than if Adelante came out of IKEA.

The Gallery is in lightweight components that take one person a few minutes to carry in and assemble. Two's better – or a small team of helpful pupils!

First thing is to settle on a setting for the Gallery with space for people to walk around and study the four faces. The base is 60cm square.

ASSEMBLY is this order – and the reverse when it's time.

- The solid blue base is on castors one at the back has a brake. The front is marked by the paintbrush – and word Front inside the hollow bit. Make sure the bolts are pulled out.
- Drop the hollow plywood lower section into the base. NB The front face
  has the Double Helix and flowers. Slide the bolts across, and the whole
  thing is now very stable. You'll find it's now easy to wheel about to avoid lugging the base and
  still go through standard height doors.
- Lift up the top section and gently ease it into place Front is more flowers and helix. A chair or small table alongside helps, so you can do the lifting up and down in two stages.
- Hang the 4 long coloured panels on the small bolts on the right of each face of the top section matching up green, red, blue and yellow. Magnets lower down hold the panels straight.
- Ditto two smaller lightweight balsa panels green on the front face, gold round the side.
- Hang the crosspiece from the two bolts halfway up the top section.
- Place the small wooden Gallery notice on the front of the base held by the paintbrush.
- Find somewhere for the Adelante Angel and its balsa signpost! The Gallery is now ready.

TRAVEL is easy, even in a small family car – as the chaplain at St Oscar Romero School in Worthing found in taking the Gallery around local primaries. The hollow sections can happily lie across the back seat, one of top of the other; or side by side in the boot. Slide the panels into the bigger of the hollow sections. The base can lie flat in the boot but NB rollers mean it can roll. The Angel quite likes being the front passenger, but only knows Forward if your satnav breaks down.
